Assessment Report of Cincinnati Bell Wireless, LLC Year Ended December 31, 2002

Cincinnati Bell Wireless, LLC ("CBW") provides Personal Communications Services ("PCS") to its own subscribers in Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky.

Due to the nature of the service plans provided to its subscribers, CBW is not able to accurately determine revenue for calls originating or terminating in a specific state. PCS subscribers are charged a monthly fee for a specific "bucket" of minutes regardless whether they use the total number of minutes they are entitled to under their service plan. CBW does not have the capability in its information systems to track revenue by the origination or termination point of calls. Ascribing a revenue amount on a per call basis is infeasible and inaccurate.

CBW believes that a reasonable approximation of intrastate revenue may be made by apportioning the total service revenue by the number of subscribers whose home address is shown to be within the State. All revenue amounts stated in this report were derived using the aforementioned apportionment.
